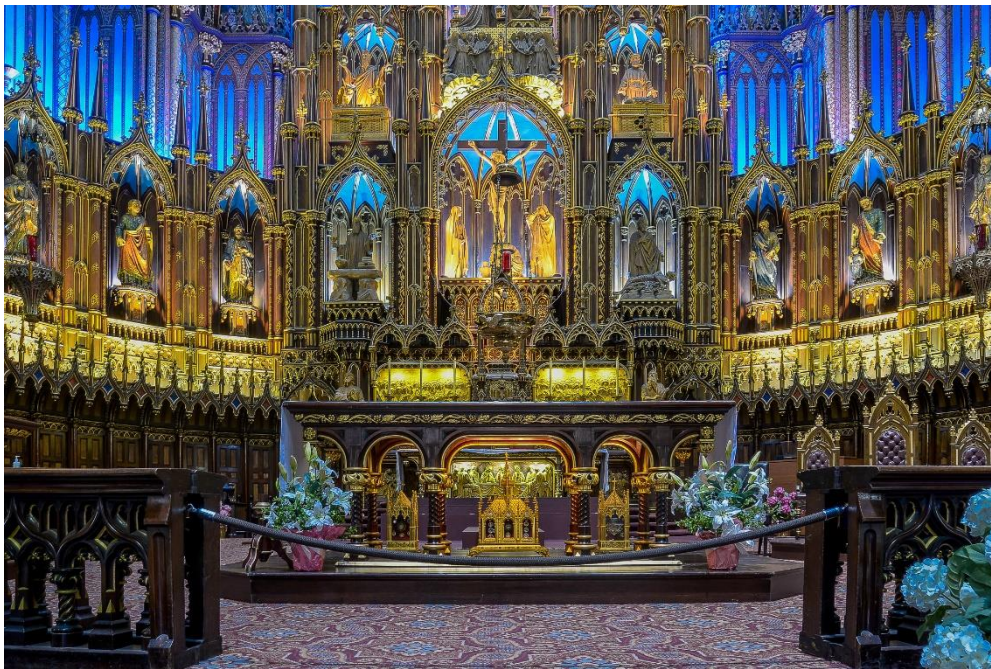

Our program is very flexible! In case, this is too much activity for you (check all details below), over two days, you can pick and choose, nothing is compulsory with us. You will be able to join us, or leave us – at any point, you wish. No problem, at all!

Otherwise, ALL family members are welcome for the duration of the two days, and have loads and loads of fun enjoying each other's company and friendship, as per usual!

Although, the program can still be modified, this is how it looks so far:

First Day: 17 September (Tuesday):



After breakfast:

at **8.45 am** we are meeting up at our Hotel Lobby, near the Concierge's desk.

We will step back in time and have a walking tour on our first day, in Montreal, exploring the Old Quarter of the city, with a local professional tour guide, which will allow us to see the historic part and also entry in the Famous Notre Dame Basilica, with her.

After our tour, we will have plenty of time to sit down together for some refreshments and a bite, and a nice rest and chat, bonding and making friendships across frontiers, as we always do.

Lunch/refreshments, which you yourself consume are the **ONLY** expense you will have to cover yourself, as per every year !]

Second Day: 18 September, Wednesday

We are meeting, again, in our Hotel Lobby, **9.45am** at the same spot, as on our first day.



We are going to visit Canada's largest food market, the Jean-Talon Market.

There will be opportunities to taste test in the market and kiosks selling such tasty fare as Calamari & Chips or Olive & Épices, exquisite oils and spices. Jean-Talon merchants, such as Boucherie les Fermes Saint-Vincent, have been growing or breeding organic food for years.

Havre aux Glaces specializes in unique frozen desserts, such as various ice creams and sorbets, with exotic flavours. In addition to the above, Jean-Talon Market features chocolatiers, fromageries, maple syrup makers, bakeries, wine shops, sushi, and more. "This is the real McCoy" - as someone wrote on Tripadvisor - "it is a large market where the locals come to get the freshest produce, whether seasonal or perennial. In addition, the flower section is particularly amazing - a veritable sea of dazzling blooms.

One is transfixed by the range of sausages, cheeses and other regional delicatessen/patisserie items on offer.

And there are stalls and cafes aplenty to stop for a quick snack while browsing.

The sights and smells, the chatter and the bustle, the old folks quietly having their daily cuppa - all of these make it a truly immersive experience of the ordinary lives of Montreal's inhabitants."

Once again, we will have a light lunch in a café, as on day one (self-financed).

If we will still have any energy left after lunch, we will visit the neighbouring Rosemont-La Petite-Patrie, one of Canada's most prominent Italian communities.

It is also called: Little Italy and is concentrated along the convivial bends of Saint-Lawrence Boulevard. Known for its fantastic and authentic Italian fare, which also includes Renaissance architecture and the picturesque Rue Saint-Rominique with its cheerful homes and splendid gardens and the ornamented thoroughfare of Plaza Saint-Hubert.

On both days, we will be back well in time, before our family members finish their meetings at the Conference, to catch up with them and ready for the evening entertainment.

Please, bring your most **comfortable walking shoes** for both days and perhaps rain proof jackets or an umbrella, just in case!
